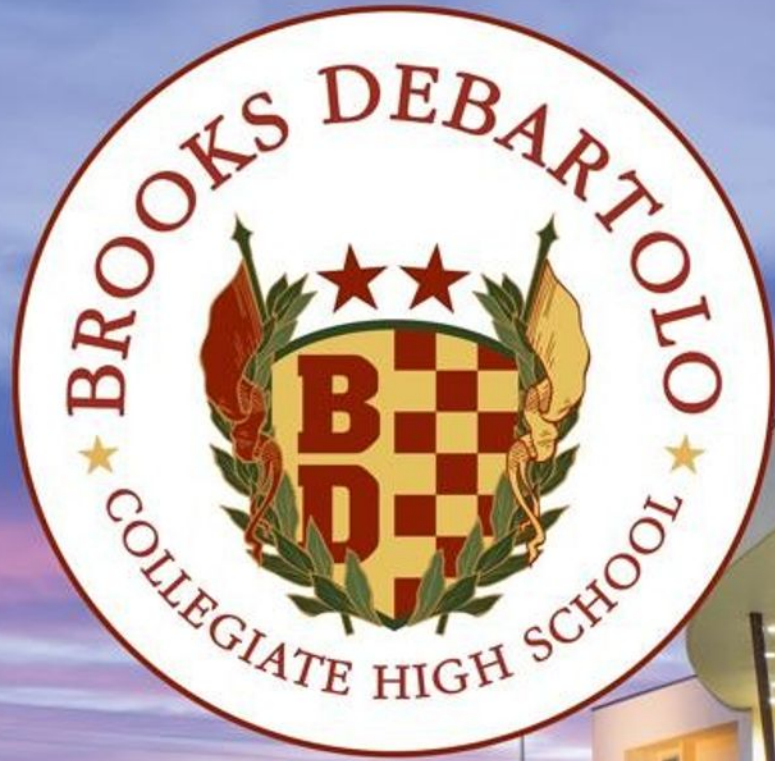


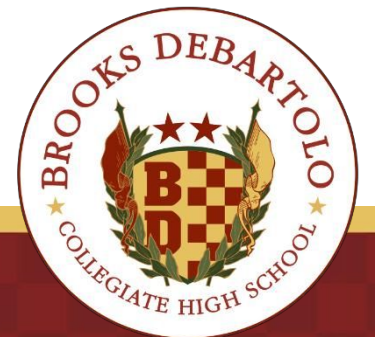

# What is Dual Enrollment?

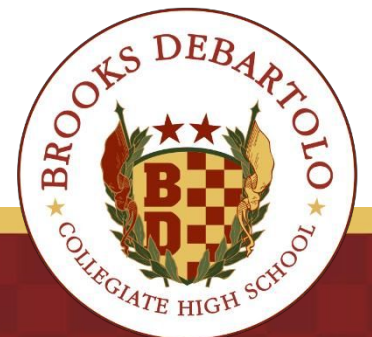
- Eligible students are able to take college-level courses through Hillsborough Community College. The student will earn college AND high school credit for these courses
- Students will earn an extra weight of .08 per half credit for DE courses (same as AP courses)



# HCC Dual Enrollment Basics

## Eligibility

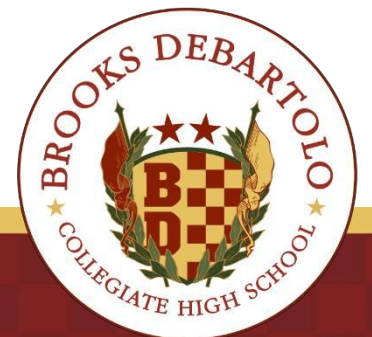
- 3.0 unweighted high school (state) GPA
- College Readiness Scores
  - SAT/PSAT: 24 Reading Subscore/ 25 Writing Subscore / 24 Math Subscore
  - Digital PSAT: 490 Reading & Writing/ 480 Math
  - PERT: 106 Reading/ 114 Math / 103 Writing
  - ACT: 19 Reading / 19 Math / 17 English



# HCC Dual Enrollment Basics

## Student & Parent Agreement

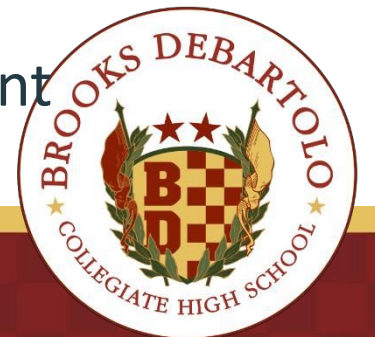
- **Independent: Student Driven!**
  - We cannot contact teachers on students' behalf.
  - HCC Instructors are under no obligation to speak to family members- most of the time, they won't speak to anyone other than the HCC student.
- Difficulties may arise as students work through operational and academic issues at HCC.
  - Students must be prepared to work through such issues.



# HCC Dual Enrollment Basics

## Selecting Courses

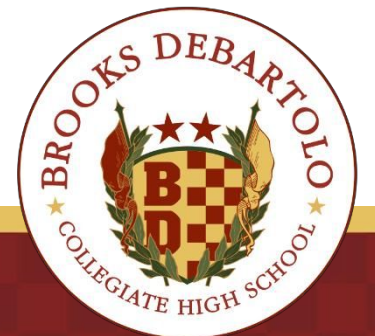
- **Determine your purpose!**
  - Are you pursuing an A.A. degree?
  - Interested in taking college-level electives that are not offered in BDCHS' AP Program?
- **Talk with your School Counselor and an HCC Counselor**
- **Consider:**
  - Live lecture vs. Online
  - Students cannot be on BDCHS campus during their dual enrollment blocks.



# HCC Dual Enrollment Basics

## Course Registration

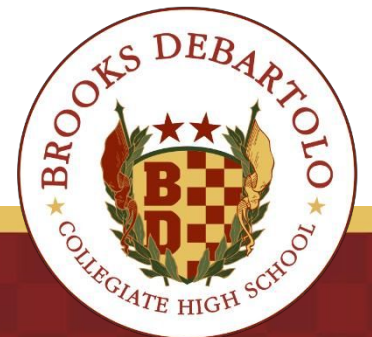
- Students must submit a request to BDCHS for Course Authorization Form B for all courses the student wishes to take.
- Course Authorization materials are submitted digitally *by the student* to HCC Dual Enrollment Office for approval.
- HCC will contact you with further directions on how to enroll once the paperwork has been approved.

# HCC Dual Enrollment Basics

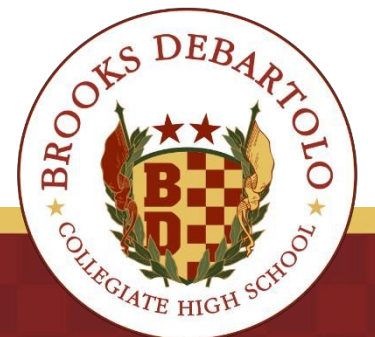
## Scheduling

- Students may take **one block off per HCC course, or a full day off for 3 or more HCC courses.**
- DE off blocks cannot be taken in the middle of the day where a student would need to leave and return to BDCHS.
- For students taking Hybrid or Live-Lecture courses:
  - Make sure the class meeting time will work with your BDCHS schedule.  
Remember to factor in travel time.
- **Students cannot be on BDCHS campus during their dual enrollment blocks.**



# HCC Early Admissions

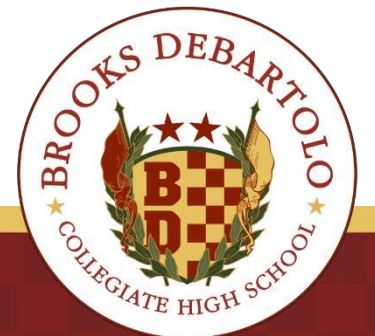
- Student must be a rising Senior.
- Students would be considered a *freshman in college* and only take up to 2 courses at BDCHS.
- Students would have to be enrolled in 12-15 credit hours at HCC.
- Students can only apply for early admission for the **Fall semester**





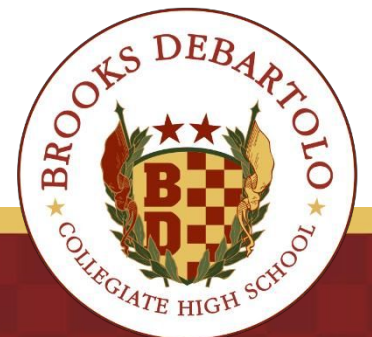
# HCC Early Admission Eligibility

- Requirements:
  - Must be a Senior in the Fall
  - 3.5 unweighted high school (state) GPA at the end of 11th grade
  - Not in the running for a distinction (Valedictorian or Salutatorian)
  - Have completed all requirements for high school graduation or have one or more of the following courses remaining:
    - 1 credit of English and/or
    - 1 credit of Math and/or
    - 0.5 credit of Economics and/or
    - 0.5 credit of American Government
    - College Readiness Scores on SAT/ ACT/ or PERT



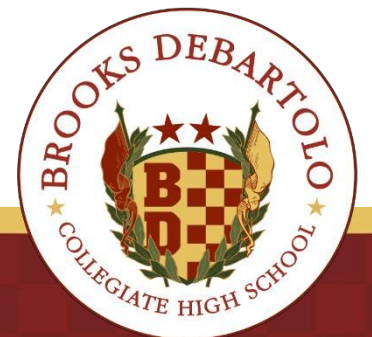
# Cautionary Notes

- Grades will show on your high school AND future college transcripts, including those that you do not earn credit for (F, W, WN)
  - The college GPA you establish now stays with you!
- Dual Enrollment students who do not earn a passing grade of C or above or receive a W or WN (withdrawal) in their courses may only petition to retake a course **ONCE**.
  - **Not dropping a course by the deadline is the same as withdrawing from the course!**



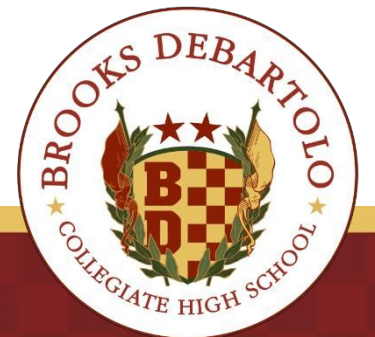
# Cautionary Notes

- Dual Enrollment students who drop below the HCC required GPA of 2.0 must petition to be reinstated into the Dual Enrollment Program.
- Some 4-year universities may not accept all HCC coursework
